


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Dear Chapter Members,

Now, moving forward, let's explore the impactful presentations that defined the Annual Conference 2024.

Speakers and Their Presentations

1. Frank Turley (OMIMO): The Transformative Role of Custodians in Project Management



We were honored to have Frank Turley, an accomplished project management author, speaker, and adviser with over 16 years of experience, as the keynote speaker.

Frank's dedication to transforming how the world learns and practices project management was evident in his presentation.

Frank explored a unique concept that goes beyond traditional project risk management. While most resources focus on the "risk owner," a team member responsible for tracking risks until they are resolved, Frank introduced the broader concept of "custodians" as used in P3.express, an open and minimalist project management system. He explained how this approach assigns custodians to follow up on various project elements, including risks, issues, lessons, and even deliverables, which has proven effective in projects worldwide. The method can be easily adapted to any project management framework, addressing key follow-up challenges and ensuring accountability.

Throughout his presentation, Frank detailed how custodians contribute to more thorough oversight and highlighted the benefits of this approach, such as improved project follow-up and efficiency. He also shared practical tips for integrating custodians into any project management practice.

2. Mari-Ella Juhola & Maria Könkkölä (Wärtsilä): Curious Catalysts: PMO's Role in Empowering Agile Evolution at Wartsila

Mari-Ella and Maria shared their insights on the evolving role of the Project Management Office (PMO) in fostering an agile culture within an organization. Mari-Ella, the Head of Development Management Office at Wärtsilä



Information Management, has been at the forefront of the company's Agile



transformation, driven by her passion for leadership, agile methodologies, and emerging technologies.

Maria, a Project Manager, Agile Coach, and Founder of the Virtual Agile Coaching Network at Wärtsilä, brings relentless curiosity and a collaborative spirit to her work, inspiring others to

thrive and succeed.

Their session explored the transformative journey of Wärtsilä's PMO and how embracing curiosity enables project managers and the PMO to not only adapt to change but lead it. In a world where change is the only constant, they shared practical insights on how to stay relevant and champion agile transformation from the ground up. The presentation emphasized the PMO's vital role in fostering an environment where agility thrives and project teams can drive sustainable change.

3. Milla Ranta (Millainen Consulting): Co-creating Project Success



Milla is a change professional, coach, and project management developer with extensive expertise spanning various industries and sectors. Milla is known for providing lean, sustainable, and people-first solutions in project management development, with a value-driven focus on Al integration and PMO. Her approach emphasizes customer value and well-being,

positioning her as a strategic partner for long-term success. Milla's presentation, explored the collaborative nature of achieving project goals. She began by explaining how project success is inherently a group effort, driven by the combined skills and dedication of diverse teams. While defining "success" as reaching the project's set goals may seem straightforward, she highlighted the complexity introduced by a rapidly transforming environment.



Milla discussed the essential competencies that project teams must develop to adapt and thrive in such an environment. Her session emphasized the need for a co-creative approach where project groups work together effectively, leveraging varied strengths to navigate shifting objectives and achieve sustainable success.

4. Niklas Mannfolk (Huawei): Navigating the Maze: The Complexities of Regulating AI



Niklas, the Public Affairs and Communications Director of Huawei Finland brought his extensive experience in the tech industry and background as a Special Adviser to the Minister of Justice to the stage. With a keen understanding of the intersection between technology, regulation, and societal impact, Niklas provided valuable insights into the complexities of regulating Al. His focus on the opportunities that

technology presents for improving societies added depth to the conversation.

Niklas's session was deeply informative and addressed the challenges that come with the fast-paced advancements in AI. He discussed key strategies for project managers to navigate the complex and evolving AI landscape, emphasizing the importance of continuous learning to stay updated with technological changes. Niklas also highlighted the role of cross-functional teams in ensuring successful project outcomes, as well as the need to develop robust governance frameworks to maintain ethical compliance and accountability in AI projects.

His session provided practical insights on how to approach AI integration in projects responsibly, balancing innovation with regulation to achieve sustainable progress.

5. Victor Brück (Nordea): The Value and Necessity of Diversity and Inclusion

Victor, Diversity and Inclusion Expert at Nordea, brought his wealth of experience in HR, marketing, and employer branding to the conference. In his current role, Victor is passionate about making Nordea a more inclusive and diverse organization for both employees and customers. His commitment to driving meaningful change has also led him to study the experiences of LGBTQ+ individuals in the banking industry, aiming to create impactful transformations within the industry and society at large.



Victor's session provided valuable strategies for fostering inclusive



environments in project management. He emphasized the importance of embracing diverse perspectives, promoting continuous learning, and challenging entrenched habits to enhance communication and shared responsibility within teams. His presentation highlighted the pivotal role leaders play in

driving team performance, ensuring psychological safety, and improving decisionmaking through inclusive practices.

Victor's insights reinforced the idea that true progress in project management stems from valuing diversity and cultivating a culture where everyone's voice contributes to collective success.

6. Edward Lundholm (Data Center Company): Sustainable Data Centres



Edward, an international construction director with extensive experience across various asset classes and a data centre specialist, brought his unique insights to the stage. With a career that has spanned over 20 countries, Edward has become a leading advocate for sustainable practices and renewable energy use in the data centre industry.

In his presentation on sustainable data centres, Edward discussed the significant power consumption of data centres and outlined key strategies to reduce their environmental impact, particularly in the Nordics. He provided an overview of what data centres (DCs) are and explored why Al-driven operations consume vast amounts of power. Edward examined the origins of this power, delved into efficiency metrics like Power Usage Effectiveness (PUE), and explained the importance of green building practices, including the pros and cons of pursuing LEED Certification.

Subtopics in Edward's session included discussions on enhancing efficiency through advanced cooling methods, such as liquid cooling, and the integration of renewable energy sources to offset carbon footprints. He also highlighted emerging technologies, such as Small Modular Nuclear Reactors (SMRs) and power cogeneration, as potential solutions for future sustainability.



Edward concluded his session by emphasizing that Nordic data centres are at the forefront of pioneering sustainable technologies. He underscored the need for continuous innovation and the adoption of cutting-edge solutions to manage growing IT energy demands without sacrificing environmental responsibility.

7. Taru Weckroth (Midagon Finland): Global ERP Implementation - Success and Struggles at Vaisala

Taru, a seasoned business and technology transformation leader with over 20 years of experience. Specializing in M&A integration and complex change initiatives, Taru has deep expertise in ERP technologies, data management, and analytics. Her approach to project management is results-focused, emphasizing respect, clear communication, and strategic prioritization.



In her session, Taru recounted the two-year journey of implementing a new ERP solution across all of Vaisala's global business entities. The project, which went live in early 2024, was marked by significant challenges as the team navigated complex business requirements and high-quality expectations. Despite these obstacles, the project team achieved success through strong team spirit, coordination, and

transparent communication among all stakeholders.

Taru highlighted the importance of setting realistic priorities and effectively balancing time, resources, and quality to optimize productivity. She stressed the need for flexibility in project schedules to safeguard quality and maintain the well-being of the team. Early prioritization of critical functionalities and adapting plans based on feedback and evolving project requirements were central to her approach.

Her session provided valuable lessons, from fostering clear communication across teams to leveraging cross-functional collaboration for better decision-making and higher project success rates.

Recognizing Excellence: The 2024 Awards Ceremony

A key highlight of the Annual Conference 2024 was the awards ceremony, where exceptional contributions to the project management community were celebrated. The awards were presented by Donna Bernabe, acknowledging the dedication and impactful work of organizations that have significantly contributed to advancing the field.



The Appreciation Award was given to Wärtsilä, with Mari-Ella and Maria accepting the honor on behalf of their team. This award recognized Wärtsilä's efforts in fostering innovation and leadership within the project management sphere.



The Outstanding Partnership Award was presented to IIL, represented by Ilona Kajava and Inna Halminen. This award highlighted IIL's exemplary collaboration and ongoing commitment to supporting the project management community.



The Exceptional Support Award went to Innovategy, accepted by Sina Ghazi, in recognition of their unwavering support and significant contributions to the success of various PMI Finland initiatives.
